

What is Passport to Safety?

Passport to Safety is a national health and safety awareness program that aims to revolutionize thinking among youth about on-the-job safety. Through Passport to Safety students challenge an on-line, no-fail "test" and earn a transcript verifying completion of the test to attach to their resumes.

The program builds on safety knowledge youth gain in public safety courses, teacher-led school programs, self-study and work experience. Passport transcript holders will possess the basic knowledge to help them say no to unsafe work, insist on job-specific training and exercise their rights and responsibilities at work.

Passport to Safety is not a substitute for the job-specific health and safety training that employers under provincial, territorial or national jurisdiction are required to give their workers. All employers must still provide the training necessary for each worker to be able to perform his or her job safely.

Registering for this lifetime membership and on-line safety challenge normally costs \$9.00 per person. Funding from WSIB has allowed us to offer it to teachers to provide to their students for FREE.

How does a teacher take advantage of this resource?

1. Fill out the attached application form and fax it to the number at the bottom of the form –or- go to www.PassporttoSafety.com/OntarioTeachers and complete the on-line registration form. Note: you must provide your email address.
2. Passport to Safety will email you back 2 things – first a list of Passport to Safety “pin numbers” and “passwords” for you to hand out to your students. Second, a special Passport to Safety “pin number” and “password” for you so that you can go behind the scenes to view your students’ progress (more information about this is provided on the special Ontario teachers web site).
3. Provide each student with a pin number and password, and perhaps a copy of the youth instruction sheet (attached to this package and available on the Ontario teachers web site).
4. Have each student provide you with a copy of his or her personal Passport to Safety transcript or certificate. These can only be printed when the Passport to Safety test is successfully completed – so you’ll know they’re done.
